



HOW TO: FIND A JOB ON CAMPUS

Know Your Eligibility

Students can work on campus, regardless of work study status. Still, it's helpful to know if you receive work study or not.

Look at your financial aid award letter. You will see either "**Federal work study**" or "**Tufts work study**" listed. If you don't see either of those, consider yourself **non-work study**. If you did not apply for financial aid, you do not have an award letter and can also consider yourself **non-work study**.


